## Jeffrey-Angelo Construction Co., Inc. Taking the Time to Build It Right

Jeffrey A. Folino admits that if you are looking for the fastest builder to build your next custom home, then you should scratch the name of his company, Jeffrey-Angelo Construction Company, Inc., off your list. The philosophy of this 10-year-old custom residential building company in Toms River is not to build a home in

record time, but to build each home with the best products, superior craftsmanship and quality workmanship, taking whatever time necessary to do the job right.

"I will never be accused of being the fastest builder. For me, it is more important for it to be done right," says Folino, who personally does a majority of the building, including framing, trim work and painting. His wife, Laura, handles all of the company's administrative work, including the bookkeeping. He says it can take from five months to a year to complete a large custom home, depending on the weather and the number of changes. "Every home I do is built like it is like my own,

and I do as much as I can myself. I am also on site every day, so I occasionally have to turn down a home because I refuse to sub everything out. If I cannot do a majority of the work, I will not build it."



Folino builds from three to six homes a year in the \$300,000 to \$1 million price range, which does not include the price of the property. He specializes in large custom houses on the water; however, he also does some custom renovations and additions. In fact, what has become known as a "Jeffreybuilt" home in the industry has become synonymous with high quality homes built to withstand the harsh conditions of shore weather. He uses all Douglas Fir lumber, 2x6 exterior walls, TJI floor joists, ring shank galvanized

nails, Andersen windows, Solar Seal sealant and CertainTeed roofing and siding. "I also use twice as many nails than most builders, and a quart of glue on each piece of 3/4-inch sub floor," he explains. "Before my house is insulated, I seal every hole to prevent any drafts. I also insulate every wall in the house, including between bedrooms and bathrooms and floors for sound control. It just makes a better product when it is done."

"I would like to take a moment to thank you for the fine job you did building my house. You are correct when you say no one builds a house like you—'Jeffrey-built' from the cases and cases of nails to the cases and cases of caulk."

As a custom builder, Folino says that numerous changes are part of the package and he takes it in stride. "It does not bother me because the bottom line is the customer being happy with their home and our product. My theory has always been that I do not make money on callbacks, so I try to do it right the first time."

"There were several changes that I asked Mr. Folino to make after he had completed what was in the original blueprints, and he always did exactly what I asked for. Mr. Folino's answer was always, 'Whatever you want.' Jeffrey Folino puts his heart and soul into his work. The construction project was an extension of himself, and that showed in the excellent quality of his work."

Folino also welcomes customers to visit the job, either as the owners of the home, or those who are considering hiring him as their builder. "I like my customers to be at the house while it is being built. For most of the houses I do, the people are there every day or every other day," Folino adds. "And if they are bidding out for a builder to build their home, I want them to come see the job and speak with my customers. I feel it's very important for them to come see my work in person."

The pride and love for the work that he does is evident in each and every home that Jeffrey Folino builds. "I want my customers to be 100 percent satis-

fied and have a home that is built as well as it can be. Anyone can build a house that looks nice on the outside, but we build our houses so that it will still be the best house it can be, 10, 20, 30 years down the road. I am proud of my work and get a lot of satisfaction from it. I honestly believe the work we produce is second to none."
